Toy Bricks Toughen Up series

Series points are allocated depending on the number of riders in the race, as follows:

Riders	Points
8 or more	1st: 5 points, 2nd: 3 points, 3rd: 2 points, everyone else: 1 point
6–7	1st: 3 points, 2nd: 2 points, everyone else: 1 point
4–5	1st: 2 points, everyone else: 1 point
Less than 4	Every competitor receives 1 point.

For people who have done duty during the series, their final points score is simply scaled by a factor of 4/3 – in other words, their average points score for the other three races is credited to them for the race that they do duty.

Fees are due on race day; entrants will *not* be allowed to start in any ECC race until fees have been paid. No late entries will be accepted for either scratch races or handicaps. Entries to handicaps can be submitted to the handicapper via email or TeamApp, or on any race day before the event.

Northern CC events


