This Saturday we race at Casey Fields, Cranbourne East, starting at 2 pm. Registrations will close at 1.45 pm, and you can enter ahead of time via TeamApp as usual.

It's the start of a big and busy month for the club.

- The summer twilight crit series at METEC gets under way at 6 pm on Tuesday 8 October and is once again proudly sponsored by Croydon Cycleworks.
- Saturday 12 October is the day of the Club Road Championships, which this year are at Yarra Glen.
- Coming up on Saturday 19 October is the 47.6 km Team Time Trial at Thornton, sponsored by Orger Engines. This is a handicap event and is open to all VCV riders. Women's teams are especially encouraged to take part. Entries (by email to peter.mackie@citywide.com.au) close at midnight on Wednesday 16 October. If you don't have a team, enter anyway and Peter Mackie will assign you to one. See the flyer at the end for more details.
- Then on Sunday 20 October there will be a 'Captain's choice' club ride around Wandin more details to follow.
- The month winds up (for us) on Saturday 26 October with a big afternoon of racing at Gruyere, including the first 'Raclemania' A Grade super race, followed by a big night at Maroondah Sports Club, Dublin Road, Ringwood East – the Annual Awards Night, with special guest speaker and presenter David McKenzie. I had just enough to hold off J-P who was sprinting from the back, with Alex on my wheel in 3rd. Kevin missed the podium but, as always, was very strong for the whole race.
