#### A Grade

March 2020 is a significant month for me. My bike is ten years old. I bought this bike to race at the Baw Baw Classic. It was streaks ahead of my old aluminium bike that I bought secondhand off a friend. For one thing, my new Giant actually fit me. I raced at the Classic with Andy Burmas, who was much fitter than me. I don't think I saw him all day, although visibility wasn't great, with almost constant rain from Warragul to the base of Baw Baw and then snow falling for most of the climb. I think that was the closest I've been to hypothermia. I may have been the last rider to finish before the sag wagon, and Andy was waiting at the finish line and presented me with my finisher's medal. I haven't seen Andy for ages, but memories of friendships last longer than the details of a race.

Last Saturday my bike was celebrating and wanted to jump off the front soon after we started. I had quite a gap after a couple of laps, but realistically I wasn't going anywhere unless someone else got enthused and joined me. Gradually I floated back to the group of nine. The pace was high and there wasn't anyone who seemed to be struggling. I would say we averaged an attack every lap, but

nobody was given an inch. At the same time, the pace wasn't slowing down after attacks were caught, either. Other than the high pace, the only bit of excitement was the backfire from Paul Firth's bike. I thought he had punctured but it turned out that he had broken a spoke – something he only realised when he pulled over with two to go to watch the final sprint and found that his brakes had been rubbing the whole time.

With around ten minutes to go, Rob Amos put in an attack and Tony Kimpton set out after him. They built a decent gap and J-P saw an opportunity disappearing, so he jumped with Cav glued to his wheel. They soon bridged across to Rob and Tony and the gap to the other six continued to build. I think it might have been Perry Peters who decided it was worth the chase and went out after the four. I was stuck to Perry's wheel and Steve Ross to mine. At that stage the other three, Paul Firth, Alex Randall and Steve Parker, called it quits and decided to watch the final sprint from the sidelines. Perry, Steve and I put in some mighty turns and mowed down the four ahead pretty quickly, but not without expending quite a bit of energy. If I recall correctly, we only had about a lap and a half to go so we tried to recover as quickly as possible. Heading down the back straight for the final time I positioned



myself behind Steve, but it was J-P that led it out, going tight on the final corner. I followed Steve after J-P up the finish straight and managed to pull alongside, but Steve's pace was too high, and the gap was too tight. I think a bike length would have covered all three of

us, but it was Steve, from J-P, then me in 3rd. It was great to see Steve on the top of the podium again, but kudos to all ten, it was a hard race, well fought by everyone and a great group of friends to share a race and some banter with.

Fees are due on race day; entrants will *not* be allowed to start in any ECC race until fees have been paid. No late entries will be accepted for either scratch races or handicaps. Entries to handicaps can be submitted to the handicapper via email or TeamApp, or on any race day before the event.
