ECC Covid Safety

A Message from the ECC Covid team

Please note the following club policies & requirements as we strive to maintain a safe environment for all members and ECC event attendees.

Vaccination - Proof of current vaccination is required to be shown at each ECC event.

No Vax No Race No Exemptions.

Positive Covid test reporting – We now request that members immediately advise ECC if they or a family member tests positive to Covid-19. This will allow the club to immediately advise other club members whom attended events associated with the confirmed case &/or close contact, which in turns allows each member to monitor and test as appropriate. In the interest of personal privacy, the names of reported cases will not be provided to other club members. Please note that each circumstance will differ, with its own level of potential exposure depending on the role of the person attending the relevant event. As such, the club's response to each situation may vary. An example of this may be a `Rider` carrying a higher risk as opposed to a spectator, official or a dependant of either.

- **Symptoms** We request that members DO NOT attend ECC events if feeling unwell or displaying any flu-like symptoms. *If in doubt, two seasons of `The Witcher` are available on Netflix and are recommended.*
- **Social Distancing** Please respect that other members may or may not be as comfortable around groups of people at this time, but still wish to turn up and race in a `safe as possible environment`, so please continue to social distance when not racing.

Racing Safely, Overtaking Safely

When passing a slower bunch or lone rider, please have the courtesy to give them room, especially if you are overtaking or about to pass on a corner. This is especially relevant when racing at Metec.

We all know the fastest line through a corner is to hit the apex. But you cannot do this safely if you are overtaking a slower rider or bunch. Give them room so they too can safely negotiate the corner.

As the lead rider of a faster bunch you may have two, three or more riders on your wheel, all following your line. If you take the apex, the Slower bunch/rider is severely cramped for road space and may result in an incident!

Safe riding!

If you are the lead rider about to pass a slower rider/bunch, give them more room than you think they need, and don't cut down until you are well and truly passed them.

Riders following the leader must resist the temptation to cut down also.

As the lead rider, sometimes you are at your physical limit and your concentration may not be 100%.

This is where the second or third placed rider should call out to 'Stay up, give them room'. It's important to notify the slower bunch of your approach-calling out- 'A grade', 'B grade' etc. but what's the point if you squeeze down on them and give them no or little road to ride on. Not all members have the bike handling skills of a Pro. Some of us need just a tiny bit of room!






Croydon Cycleworks Summer Twilight Crit Series, METEC, 11 January

Congratulations to Former Eastern member Stephan Jusypiw completed an Everest on the well-known Dandenong's climb, Perrins Creek Rd, over the Christmas break



Starting at 3:20am, it took Steph 15:06 hrs riding time and 52 laps to complete a distance of 290.16km.

Mt Everest stands at 8,849m, and Steph well and truly beat that climbing 10,252m. Although it nearly didn't happen, narrowly avoiding a crash in the first hour when a deer ran out in front of him while descending.

I think my fitness is gradually coming back after my very lazy lockdown period in 2021. Last week I even managed to hang onto the A grade bunch on Tuesday night. Although one race may not be a good indicator of overall form.

I skipped Casey last weekend and spent a few days in the Bright area. My buddy Rod Binedell, who's done the occasional race with Eastern, has a house in Wandiligong. There is no better place to base yourself for a cycling weekend. The weather wasn't the best on Thursday and Friday (torrential rain), but we did a couple of road rides together on the Saturday and Sunday. The memorable one was up Buffalo. We left Wandi at 7am under heavy fog. It was a pretty miserable 10 degrees through town and out to the base of the climb.

This first milestone up the climb is Eurobin Falls and as we peered upwards through the fog there was a huge amount of water cascading down the mountain over the big granite faces. I've not seen anything like that amount of water there before.

From that point we gradually started to emerge from the fog. It was so nice to feel some sun on my back and it's amazing how much difference that can make to how your legs feel. By Mackey's lookout we were above the fog and it was looking like a beautiful clear day. I snapped the photo below, but it certainly doesn't do the moment justice.



The rest of the climb to the gap was a peaceful cruise, enjoying the sun, the mountain and recalling some stories from our 28 years of riding together. We considered going on to the Chalet. It was the perfect day for it, but Rod has young kids, and we decided that breakfast with the kids was the priority. Sometimes you don't want to ruin the perfect ride by pushing on too far.








Note that on Jan 30th we have a new course, Holloway Drive in Bayswater- Just off Dorset Rd- it's flat and fast.

Note: Graded scratch race entries are accepted ahead of time on TeamApp, or on the day up until 15 minutes before the advertised race start time. Handicap entries close the Tuesday or Wednesday before the race, as advertised. Riders who enter a handicap *must* pay the entry fee regardless of whether they participate. Fees are due on race day; entrants will *not* be allowed to start in any ECC race until fees have been paid. No late entries will be accepted for either scratch races or handicaps. Entries to handicaps can be submitted to the handicapper via email or TeamApp, or on any race day before the event.
