ECC Covid Safety - Dale Walton

In undertaking a periodic review of the current ECC vaccination policy, the committee has voted to retain the requirement to be fully vaccinated to attend all ECC events.

- Please respect that some members may or may not be as comfortable around large groups at this time, but still wish to race in a `safe as possible environment`, so please continue to social distance when not racing.



Safety Notice- Rob Lackey

Over the coming weeks, we will draft and communicate updated procedures on the pre-race procedures. This will relate to the Event and Traffic Marshalls along with the Race Referee. The emphasis will be on safety, setting up a safe race circuit, race start procedures and ending the race along with the circuit closure and pack-up.

It is likely that there will be some changes to the pre-determined arrival times for the Marshals on the day. Noting of course, like you, the people that are drafting these procedures are volunteers and are certainly aware of other commitments outside of the race day event.

It is important that we do update what we are doing now to ensure that we maintain a safe culture which is compliant with best practice and legal requirements.

In addition to the upcoming alterations to the pre-race procedures, the Traffic Marshals will have access to new industry standard High Vis Vests and flashing amber beacons for use. I will hopefully be at the next few races to take you through the new items as a Traffic Marshal.









Rocco Drive Sun 13th Mar
